The Bullet starter is included in the Accessories pack.
You can also purchase it for an additional \$70 for the JJ-1400 or \$120 for the JJ-1800.
Note that thee fadec combo's are purely that, a turbine and fadec.. No battery, fuel pump, etc.
If you would like a fully operation turbine look at the flight packs or a Fadec Combo and a running pack.. however the second option does not meet M.A.A.A guidelines as is.
